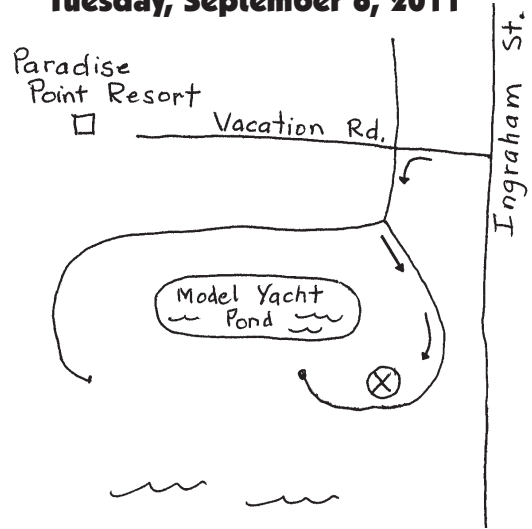

On the Lift with Laura

One of our members who pitches in to run an occasional activity is Rosalyn Smyth. When you talk to Rosalyn you notice an obvious British accent. Roz was born and grew up in Hinchley Wood, Esher, Surrey just 20 miles southwest of London. She attended Tolworth County School for Girls and then went to Brooklands Technical College in Weybridge for a one-year business course where she learned shorthand, typing, business law, commerce, and economics classes. After leaving school, her first position was in Kingston Upon Thames at Hawker Siddeley Aviation (now British Aerospace) where she worked for a year in the Buying Office and then for a year as secretary to the Public Relations Manager and the Technical Sales Manager.

Roz wanted to leave England and see the world so she got a Visa to live and work in the United States and, with a cousin, took the original HMS Queen Elizabeth from Southampton to New York. After a short visit in New York City, they took a bus to Chicago where they both secured positions at Loyola University, the Lake Shore Campus. Roz worked for the Chairman of the Biology Department. After a year, they took the Great Northern train from Chicago to Seattle, then the Surfliner train down to Portland, Santa Barbara, and San Diego. In La Jolla, Roz found a job with Dr. Clifford Graves. He was President of the American Youth Hostels, on the La Jolla Town Council, on the board of the La Jolla Civic Orchestra & Chorus Association, and active in the La Jolla Rotary Club. Roz did administrative work for all these organizations as well as his medical office. In addition, in 1964, he had started the International Bicycle Touring Society. Managing this became most of Roz's work. When Dr. Graves retired, Roz moved the Society's office to her home and kept everything going. Eventually the Society became the 'non-profit' Bicycle Adventure Club which Roz ran for nine years. This took her to Europe for up to three months each year, setting up and conducting tours.

When the Board decided to make her position voluntary, Roz moved with a friend to Mystic, Connecticut and spent time with him there and also in Englewood Beach, Florida. They decided to apply for jobs at Grand Teton National Park and spent two seasons there, the second as Park Rangers.

Roz's dad fell ill so Roz went back to England for a year to help out her mom. On her return she secured a job as Park Ranger Supervisor at Grand Teton National Park. When the season ended, Roz returned to San Diego and landed a job as an Administrative Assistant at the Shiley Eye Center. After eight years there, she moved over to Moores Cancer Center where she worked until she retired.

Roz did some skiing while living in Chicago. In San Diego, she joined Torrey Pines to go on a Mammoth trip but really didn't like the bus too much so she didn't renew her membership that year. Later she rejoined to play tennis and also enjoyed biking, camping, some skiing and, of course, all of our social activities.

Far West Convention

This year Joe Goldhammer and I were Torrey Pines' Man and Woman of the Year and both won San Diego Council of Ski Clubs' Man and Woman of the Year. **(Torrey Pines had Man and Woman win at the Council level when Diane Mensch and Brad Davis received this honor in 1978 and now Joe and Laura in 2011.)** June 9-12 we represented San Diego at the Far West Ski Association Convention, hosted by the Los Angeles Council of Ski Clubs in "beautiful" Industry Hills, CA. Rusty Etzel was there as SDCSC's representative on the Man and Woman of the Year Judging Panel. All Men and Women of the Year from different councils

are judged again and the "Number 1" Man and Woman are honored at the Awards Banquet on Saturday night. The three of us were TPSC's convention delegates.

At check-in we received a nice canvas shoulder bag full of goodies. A glance at the itinerary for the weekend showed a schedule similar to previous conventions; although there are always new and interesting speakers and new things to learn.

Joe and I went to the FWSA suite to attend a special party for the Men and Women of the Year and judges from all the councils.

The Silent Auction and Dance was at the main ballroom and at this event you meet reps from many different ski areas and tour companies, sign-up for appointments with them during Saturday's Travel Expo, bid on the trips they have donated to the auction, and pick up lots of giveaways.

At 7:00 AM Saturday morning, it's back to the ballroom for breakfast and the official opening of the convention. 1964 Olympic Silver Medalist, Billy Kidd was there.

Next we went to the Terrace for the Travel Expo. I had ten-minute small-group meetings with the five ski areas that I had scheduled the night before and then I left to attend the Far West Racing Association meeting. At the FWRA meeting we discussed issues brought up during the previous season and plans for the upcoming season.

Candidates were asked tough questions, like what do we do to build and/or retain membership and what do we do to promote safety. They also asked what we did in the way of charitable and community involvement and I was proud and happy to talk about all the things that both our club and council do.

After lunch, Joe and I headed for the Public Affairs Panel which consisted of Tony Hawk, Dave Ludwig, founder of the American Cancer Society's Hope on the Slopes program, three World War II vets from the 10th Mountain Division, and Scott Bowker, FWSA VP of Public Affairs, as the moderator. Listening to the stories the guys from the 10th Mountain Division told kept everyone on the edge of their seats.

The "Number 1" Man and Woman of the Year went to Gary Gunderson of Northwest Council and Debbie Stewart of Sierra Council. Steve Bellamy received the Warren Miller Award for modern media.

Sunday morning is when a lot of FWSA business takes place and your delegates are asked to vote and contribute opinions to various issues. Officer elections were held. The only San Diegan newly elected is current SDCSC president, Eileen Sanford, who will now also hold the office of FWSA Vice President of Council Services, kind of the leader of all the council presidents. Mike Sanford will continue as Past President as his successor, Randy Lew, was reelected to FWSA President. Lots of door prizes were given out and we all said our goodbyes and left for home.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Organization: Torrey Pines Ski Club is a non-profit California Corporation.
Membership: Annual dues of \$35 are payable in full with the application for membership. Applications are available at any time at the General Meetings of the Club. Any donations made to Torrey Pines Ski Club for raffle tickets or other fund-raising events are not tax deductible.

TRIP RULES

- RESERVATIONS.** A check for the full amount required, received by the trip captain, is a request for a reservation. The trip captain will make the initial count five days after the flyer postmark. Directors of the board and Officers will be given priority if they inform the trip captain before the initial count. If there are more checks than seats available, checks will be drawn at random until the trip is filled. The trip captain will strive to reach a 50-50 male-to-female ratio. Couples should send their checks in together and they will be drawn as a pair. All participants must sign a release before departure.
- CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS.** In the event of your cancellation, a refund will be made only if the seat vacancy is filled or if monies are recovered by the club. There also will be a non-refundable cancellation fee for all cancellations whether or not your spot is filled as follows: \$10 for trips up to \$100; \$20 for trips \$100 - \$300; \$30 for trips above \$300. **There will be an additional \$20 charge for any returned checks.** All departure times, locations, lodging, and other travel arrangements are subject to change without notice.
- WAITING LIST.** On ski trips, those on the waiting list due to the lottery will be accorded priority seating on the trip announced in the following flyer if they inform the trip captain before reservations are confirmed, i.e., the fifth day after the mailing of that flyer.
- CHECKS.** Checks will be destroyed from those not going on that trip due to being on the waiting list.
- CONFIRMATIONS.** You MUST call and confirm your status with the trip captain UNLESS a SASE (self-addressed stamped envelope) is requested in the trip write up. You MUST include your work and home telephone numbers with your check.
- GUESTS.** Guests who are sponsored by a member are allowed on trips. TPSC members have 5 days priority after the newsletter announcement to sign up for a trip. After 5 days, members may sign up one guest by including an additional amount on their check as follows (unless otherwise noted): for trips under \$50, there will be either member priority or a guest fee; \$10 for trips costing \$50-\$100; \$35 (cost of membership dues) for trips costing over \$100. Guests, like members of TPSC, must be at least 21 years of age and agree to the club "General Release and Waiver."
- EVENT GUESTS:** Members and guests not on the event/trip and who join a happy hour and/or dinner will be charged \$8.00 per person per occurrence for the happy hour; \$20.00 per person per occurrence for the dinner or combo happy hour/dinner.

SASE = (Self Addressed Stamped Envelope)

The board has adopted a trip policy wherein an increase of up to 10% can be added and will not constitute grounds for cancellation without penalty. This is due to fluctuating airline costs. **TRIP INSURANCE IS NOT REQUIRED, IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED**
